

CPR Awareness

WEST CHESTER, OH – With the right tools and equipment, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) training can be the difference between saving a life and not. For the Blue Ash YMCA in Blue Ash, Ohio, training will now be easier, thanks to a donation from the Greater Cincinnati Automobile Dealers Association (GCADA) and the National Automobile Dealers Charitable Foundation (NADCF).

The CPR training unit, sponsored by Mark Sweeney Buick GMC, was presented to Kathy Lozano and Marsha Walsh of the Blue Ash YMCA on October 28, 2014, at the dealership.

CPR training has been proven to increase the likelihood of survival from ventricular fibrillation. The NADCF, partnered with the local automotive retailers and their associations have donated over 4600 manikins across the country, training more than two million people, and saving thousands of lives. “No one wants to be in a situation where they need to perform CPR on a victim, but they don’t know how to,” said Mark Sweeney, President, Mark Sweeney Buick GMC. “With this donation, the Blue Ash YMCA will be better able to train community members, teaching them how to help save lives through CPR.”
